

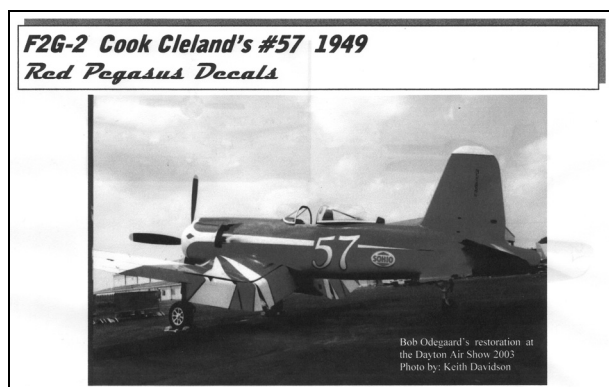
The Latest Red Pegasus Decals – Review

1/48 F2G Race #18 1949

This is Ron Pucket's grey and blue Super Corsair "Miss Port Columbus". The sheet includes everything you need, including the small texts below the cockpit, and as far as I can see everything looks accurate. The "Kendall" and "BG Spark Plugs" logos are sharp and nicely detailed. The most difficult thing will be matching paint to the colour of the blue decal print – and of course to spray a nice border between the blue and the grey...



1/72 F2G-2 Cook Cleland's #57 1949

Bob Odegard's red and white restored F2G is familiar from air displays and from Reno, and it is based on the plane flown by Ben McKillen in 1949. Again a complete sheet, including all the sunburst trim for the wings and tail. You will not know how well the fit until you have tried them on your favourite kit, but I can foresee some problems around the landing gear doors. It would have been handy to have some of the decals duplicated in those areas.

1/72 F2G-1 Cook Cleland's #94 1948-49

This sheet enables you to build either of the versions, but beware of the differences in sponsor decals between different photos! This is a simple sheet with sharp, accurate markings and sponsor decals. Unfortunately the "BG Spark Plugs" decals are much too big, but they can be left off, since they were apparently not carried at all times.

Conclusion

I think Keith's attention to detail is very good and improving by every release. The drawings for the instruction sheets are relatively small and rather simple, but most of the information you need is there. The decals are ALPS-printed, which means they do not tolerate scratching and wear as well as "normal" screen-printed decals. It is recommended to apply some protective covering, such as Micro Liquid Decal Film or Johnson's Kleer.
